

THE SPIRIT OF REJECTION

Supporting Scriptures (NIV)

- Psalm 94:14 – "For the Lord will not reject his people; he will never forsake his inheritance."
- Psalm 27:10 – "Though my father and mother forsake me, the Lord will receive me."
- John 6:37 – "All those the Father gives me will come to me, and whoever comes to me I will never drive away."
- Deuteronomy 31:6 – "Be strong and courageous. Do not be afraid or terrified because of them, for the Lord your God goes with you; he will never leave you nor forsake you."
- Joshua 1:5 – "No one will be able to stand against you all the days of your life. As I was with Moses, so I will be with you; I will never leave you nor forsake you."
- Hebrews 13:5 – "Keep your lives free from the love of money and be content with what you have, because God has said, 'Never will I leave you; never will I forsake you.'"
- Romans 8:38–39 – "For I am convinced that neither death nor life, neither angels nor demons, neither the present nor the future, nor any powers, neither height nor depth, nor anything else in all creation, will be able to separate us from the love of God that is in Christ Jesus our Lord."
- Ephesians 1:4–5 – "For he chose us in him before the creation of the world to be holy and blameless in his sight. In love he predestined us for adoption to sonship through Jesus Christ, in accordance with his pleasure and will—"
- Romans 8:15 – "The Spirit you received does not make you slaves, so that you live in fear again; rather, the Spirit you received brought about your adoption to sonship. And by him we cry, 'Abba, Father.'"
- 1 Peter 2:9 – "But you are a chosen people, a royal priesthood, a holy nation, God's special possession, that you may declare the praises of him who called you out of darkness into his wonderful light."
- 1 Peter 2:4 – "As you come to him, the living Stone—rejected by humans but chosen by God and precious to him—"
- John 15:16 – "You did not choose me, but I chose you and appointed you so that you might go and bear fruit—fruit that will last—and so that whatever you ask in my name the Father will give you."
- Galatians 4:7 – "So you are no longer a slave, but God's child; and since you are his child, God has made you also an heir."
- Psalm 139:13–14 – "For you created my inmost being; you knit me together in my mother's womb. I praise you because I am fearfully and wonderfully made; your works are wonderful, I know that full well."
- Ephesians 2:10 – "For we are God's handiwork, created in Christ Jesus to do good works, which God prepared in advance for us to do."
- Isaiah 43:4 – "Since you are precious and honored in my sight, and because I love you, I will give people in exchange for you, and nations in exchange for your life."
- Luke 12:7 – "Indeed, the very hairs of your head are all numbered. Don't be afraid; you are worth more than many sparrows."

- Zephaniah 3:17 – "The Lord your God is with you, the Mighty Warrior who saves. He will take great delight in you; in his love he will no longer rebuke you, but will rejoice over you with singing."
- Isaiah 49:15–16 – "Can a mother forget the baby at her breast and have no compassion on the child she has borne? Though she may forget, I will not forget you! See, I have engraved you on the palms of my hands; your walls are ever before me."
- Psalm 34:22 – "The Lord will rescue his servants; no one who takes refuge in him will be condemned."
- Isaiah 41:9 – "I took you from the ends of the earth, from its farthest corners I called you. I said, 'You are my servant; I have chosen you and have not rejected you.'"
- Romans 11:2 – "God did not reject his people, whom he foreknew. Don't you know what Scripture says in the passage about Elijah—how he appealed to God against Israel?"
- Matthew 10:31 – "So don't be afraid; you are worth more than many sparrows."

 **Deliverance Prayer** Father God, I come to You in the mighty name of Jesus Christ. I renounce the spirit of rejection, abandonment, and worthlessness. I close every door that has been opened to these spirits through past trauma, words spoken over me, or conditional love. Your Word says You will never leave me nor forsake me. You have chosen me and called me Your own child. I break the legal hold of rejection over my mind, emotions, and body right now. I command every spirit of fear, isolation, and shame to leave me in Jesus' name. I am accepted in the Beloved. I am secure. I am loved. Amen.

Daily Confession

- I will never be stranded because the Lord will not reject His people; He will never forsake His inheritance. (Psalm 94:14)
- Even if those closest to me abandon me, the Lord will receive me with open arms. (Psalm 27:10)
- I have been legally adopted into sonship, and I call God my true Father. I do not have to live as a slave to fear. (Romans 8:15)
- I am God's special possession, chosen before the creation of the world to be holy and blameless in His sight. (1 Peter 2:9, Ephesians 1:4)
- I am fearfully and wonderfully made. I am His unique handiwork, designed for great purposes. (Psalm 139:14, Ephesians 2:10)

The Scriptural Roots

- *The Orphan Spirit*: Rejection thrives on the lie that you are spiritually fatherless. Jesus directly confronted this root in John 14:18, promising, "I will not leave you as orphans; I will come to you."
- *The Fear of Man*: Seeking validation from human relationships rather than God creates an open door for rejection. Proverbs 29:25 warns that "fear of man will prove to be a snare, but whoever trusts in the Lord is kept safe."
- *Misplaced Identity*: Rejection forces you to view yourself through the lens of your flaws or your past failures. Scripture addresses this root by reminding us that our life is now "hidden with Christ in God" (Colossians 3:3).

THE SPIRIT OF ANGER

Supporting Scriptures (NIV)

- Proverbs 29:11 – "Fools give full vent to their rage, but the wise bring calm in the end."
- James 1:19–20 – "My dear brothers and sisters, take note of this: Everyone should be quick to listen, slow to speak and slow to become angry, because human anger does not produce the righteousness that God desires."
- Proverbs 16:32 – "Better a patient person than a warrior, a person who controls their temper than one who takes a city."
- Proverbs 14:29 – "Whoever is patient has great understanding, but one who is quick-tempered displays folly."
- Proverbs 10:19 – "Sin is not ended by multiple words, but prudent is the one who holds their tongue."
- Proverbs 15:1 – "A gentle answer turns away wrath, but a harsh word stirs up anger."
- Proverbs 15:18 – "A hot-tempered person stirs up conflict, but the one who is patient calms a quarrel."
- Proverbs 25:15 – "Through patience a ruler can be persuaded, and a gentle tongue can break a bone."
- Ecclesiastes 7:9 – "Do not be quickly provoked in your spirit, for anger resides in the lap of fools."
- Colossians 4:6 – "Let your conversation be always full of grace, seasoned with salt, so that you may know how to answer everyone."
- Ephesians 4:26–27 – "'In your anger do not sin': Do not let the sun go down while you are still angry, and do not give the devil a foothold."
- Psalm 37:8 – "Refrain from anger and turn from wrath; do not fret—it leads only to evil."
- Proverbs 19:11 – "A person's wisdom yields patience; it is to one's glory to overlook an offense."
- Matthew 5:23–24 – "Therefore, if you are offering your gift at the altar and there remember that your brother or sister has something against you, leave your gift there in front of the altar. First go and be reconciled to them; then come and offer your gift."
- Ephesians 4:31–32 – "Get rid of all bitterness, rage and anger, brawling and slander, along with every form of malice. Be kind and compassionate to one another, forgiving each other, just as in Christ God forgave you."
- Colossians 3:8 – "But now you must also rid yourselves of all such things as these: anger, rage, malice, slander, and filthy language from your lips."
- Galatians 5:22–23 – "But the fruit of the Spirit is love, joy, peace, forbearance, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness and self-control. Against such things there is no law."
- Romans 12:19 – "Do not take revenge, my dear friends, but leave room for God's wrath, for it is written: 'It is mine to avenge; I will repay,' says the Lord."
- Proverbs 22:24–25 – "Do not make friends with a hot-tempered person, do not associate with one easily angered, or you may learn their ways and get yourself ensnared."
- Proverbs 12:16 – "Fools show their annoyance at once, but the prudent overlook an insult."
- Proverbs 29:22 – "An angry person stirs up conflict, and a hot-tempered person commits many sins."

- 1 Timothy 2:8 – "Therefore I want the men everywhere to pray, lifting up holy hands without anger or disputing."
- Proverbs 14:17 – "A quick-tempered person acts foolishly, and the one who devises evil schemes is hated."

 **Deliverance Prayer** Heavenly Father, I confess that I have allowed anger, rage, and resentment to have a place in my heart. I repent for every explosive word and bitter thought. I take back the ground I gave to the enemy, and I close the door to the devil. By the power of the Holy Spirit, I pull down the strongholds of offense, retaliatory spirits, and severe temper. I forgive those who have wronged me, and I release the right to avenge myself. I receive Your peace that passes all understanding. Holy Spirit, rule my emotions and let Your fruit of gentleness and self-control take full possession of my soul. In Jesus' name, Amen.

Daily Confession

- I refuse to give full vent to my emotions; I am wise, and I bring calm in the end. (Proverbs 29:11)
- I am quick to listen, slow to speak, and slow to become angry, because my rage cannot produce God's righteousness. (James 1:19-20)
- I rule my spirit. I am patient, strong, and in total control of my temper. (Proverbs 16:32)
- I will not let the sun go down while I am still angry. I give zero footholds to the devil today. (Ephesians 4:26-27)
- I intentionally rid myself of all bitterness, rage, and malice, choosing supernatural kindness, compassion, and forgiveness instead. (Ephesians 4:31-32)

The Scriptural Roots

- *The Pride and Entitlement Root:* Anger almost always stems from unmet expectations or a belief that your rights have been violated. Jesus exposed this in Luke 6:29 by teaching an extreme standard of yielding our personal rights to preserve love.
- *The Spiritual Legal Right (The "Foothold"):* When anger is harbored past sunset, it transforms from a fleeting human emotion into a demonic vulnerability. The Greek word for "foothold" in Ephesians 4:27 is *topos*, meaning a geographical territory or legal property granted to the enemy.
- *The Inward Defilement:* Jesus explained that anger isn't caused by outside circumstances; it is an overflow of an unmanaged internal condition. In Mark 7:21-23, He warns that "from within, out of a person's heart, come evil thoughts... malice, deceit... and arrogance," which are the true sources of rage.

THE SPIRIT OF UNFORGIVENESS

Supporting Scriptures (NIV)

- Matthew 6:14–15 – "For if you forgive other people when they sin against you, your heavenly Father will also forgive you. But if you do not forgive others their sins, your Father will not forgive your sins."
- Mark 11:25 – "And when you stand praying, if you hold anything against anyone, forgive them, so that your Father in heaven may forgive you your sins."
- Colossians 3:13 – "Bear with each other and forgive one another if any of you has a grievance against someone. Forgive as the Lord forgave you."
- Luke 6:37 – "Do not judge, and you will not be judged. Do not condemn, and you will not be condemned. Forgive, and you will be forgiven."
- Matthew 18:21–22 – "Then Peter came to Jesus and asked, 'Lord, how many times shall I forgive my brother or sister who sins against me? Up to seven times?' Jesus answered, 'I tell you, not seven times, but seventy-seven times.'"
- Matthew 18:34–35 – "In anger his master handed him over to the jailers to be tortured, until he should pay back all he owed. This is how my heavenly Father will treat each of you unless you forgive your brother or sister from your heart."
- 2 Corinthians 2:10–11 – "Anyone you forgive, I also forgive. And what I have forgiven—if there was anything to forgive—I have forgiven in the sight of Christ for your sake, in order that Satan might not outwit us. For we are not unaware of his schemes."
- Luke 17:3–4 – "So watch yourselves. 'If your brother or sister sins against you, rebuke them; and if they repent, forgive them. Even if they sin against you seven times in a day and seven times come back to you saying 'I repent,' you must forgive them.'"
- Ephesians 4:32 – "Be kind and compassionate to one another, forgiving each other, just as in Christ God forgave you."

 **Deliverance Prayer** Father God, I come to You in the name of Jesus Christ to confront the spirit of unforgiveness. I admit that I have held onto the sins of others and refused to let them go. Right now, by an act of my will, I choose to forgive [Name the specific people]. I cancel the debt they owe me. I hand their actions over to Your righteous courtroom. I break the legal right that unforgiveness has held over my prayer life, and I command this heavy spirit to leave me now in Jesus' name. Amen.

Daily Confession

- I cancel all spiritual debts. I choose to bear with others and forgive every grievance, matching the exact standard of grace the Lord extended to me. (Colossians 3:13)
- My prayers are completely unhindered. When I stand praying, I freely release and forgive anyone I have held anything against. (Mark 11:25)
- I live under a wide-open heaven. Because I actively choose to forgive others, my heavenly Father continuously pours out His forgiveness onto me. (Matthew 6:14)

The Scriptural Roots

- *The Unmerciful Servant Complex*: Jesus reveals the root of unforgiveness in Matthew 18:32–33. It stems from a temporary spiritual amnesia where we forget the massive, unpayable debt of sin God forgave us, causing us to aggressively choke others over a comparatively smaller emotional debt.
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THE SPIRIT OF RESENTMENT

Supporting Scriptures (NIV)

- 1 Corinthians 13:4–5 – "Love is patient, love is kind. It does not envy, it does not boast, it is not proud. It does not dishonor others, it is not self-seeking, it is not easily angered, it keeps no record of wrongs."
- Proverbs 17:9 – "Love prospers when a fault is forgiven, but dwelling on it separates close friends."
- Proverbs 19:11 – "A person's wisdom yields patience; it is to one's glory to overlook an offense."
- Job 5:2 – "Resentment kills a fool, and envy slays the simple."
- 1 Peter 4:8 – "Above all, love each other deeply, because love covers over a multitude of sins."
- Leviticus 19:18 – "'Do not seek revenge or bear a grudge against anyone among your people, but love your neighbor as yourself. I am the Lord.'"
- Job 36:13 – "The godless in heart harbor resentment; even when he fetters them, they do not cry for help."
- Proverbs 10:12 – "Hatred stirs up conflict, but love covers over all wrongs."
- James 5:9 – "Don't grumble against one another, brothers and sisters, or you will be judged. The Judge is standing at the door!"

 **Deliverance Prayer** Lord Jesus, I repent for harboring resentment and for continuously keeping a record of how I have been wronged. I break the cycle of replaying past injuries in my mind. I ask You to heal the memories that keep triggering this resentment. I choose to overlook the offenses committed against me and throw away the ledger of debt. I command the spirit of resentment to leave my thought patterns today. In Jesus' name, Amen.

Daily Confession

- I keep no record of wrongs. My mind is governed by Christ's love, which refuses to count up, catalog, or remember the injuries of the past. (1 Corinthians 13:5)
- I refuse to dwell on faults. I do not replay past arguments or failures, because I know that dwelling on offenses kills relationships and peace. (Proverbs 17:9)
- It is my glory to overlook offenses. Wisdom gives me supreme patience, allowing me to step over insults rather than picking them up. (Proverbs 19:11)

The Scriptural Roots

- *The Record-Keeping Ledger:* The root of resentment is found in the Greek word *logizomai* used in 1 Corinthians 13:5, which means an accounting term for entering a debt into a permanent ledger. Resentment is a structural choice to mathematically track people's failures so you can use them as emotional leverage later.

THE SPIRIT OF BITTERNESS

Supporting Scriptures (NIV)

- Hebrews 12:15 – "See to it that no one falls short of the grace of God and that no bitter root grows up to cause trouble and defile many."
- Ephesians 4:31 – "Get rid of all bitterness, rage and anger, brawling and slander, along with every form of malice."
- Proverbs 14:10 – "Each heart knows its own bitterness, and no one else can share its joy."
- Acts 8:23 – "For I see that you are full of bitterness and captive to sin."
- Romans 3:14 – "Their mouths are full of cursing and bitterness."
- Job 10:1 – "I loathe my very life; therefore I will give free rein to my complaint and speak in the bitterness of my soul."
- Ruth 1:20 – "'Don't call me Naomi,' she told them. 'Call me Mara, because the Almighty has made my life very bitter.'"
- Proverbs 4:23 – "Above all else, guard your heart, for everything you do flows from it."

 **Deliverance Prayer** Holy Spirit, I ask You to shine Your light into the deep soil of my heart. I repent for letting chronic hurt turn into a root of bitterness. I pull up this poisonous root by its very base using the authority of the blood of Jesus. I refuse to let my speech, my personality, or my future be defiled by this acid. I eject all bitterness, malice, and hidden sourness from my soul right now. Wash me clean and restore my joy. In Jesus' name, Amen.

Daily Confession

- No bitter roots can grow in my heart. I stand firmly in the grace of God, actively preventing any internal poison from springing up to trouble me or infect those around me. (Hebrews 12:15)
- I am totally emptied of bitterness. I deliberately throw away all bitterness, rage, and malice, choosing instead to be a vessel of pure, sweet water. (Ephesians 4:31)
- I am no longer a captive. I break every chain of old emotional poison and step completely out of the bondage of a bitter spirit. (Acts 8:23)

The Scriptural Roots

- *Underground Defilement:* The root mechanics are laid bare in Hebrews 12:15. Bitterness behaves exactly like an invasive weed. It remains hidden underground in the subconscious mind for months, quietly drawing life away from the soul, until it suddenly bursts forth to defile your speech, health, and family.
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THE SPIRIT OF HATRED

Supporting Scriptures (NIV)

- 1 John 3:15 – "Anyone who hates a brother or sister is a murderer, and you know that no murderer has eternal life residing in them."
- 1 John 4:20 – "Whoever claims to love God yet hates a brother or sister is a liar. For whoever does not love their brother and sister, whom they have seen, cannot love God, whom they have not seen."
- Proverbs 10:12 – "Hatred stirs up conflict, but love covers over all wrongs."
- Leviticus 19:17 – "'Do not hate a fellow Israelite in your heart. Rebuke your neighbor frankly so you will not share in their guilt.'"
- Matthew 5:44 – "But I tell you, love your enemies and pray for those who persecute you,"
- 1 John 2:11 – "But anyone who hates a brother or sister is in the darkness and walks around in the darkness; they do not know where they are going, because the darkness has blinded them."
- 1 John 2:9 – "Anyone who claims to be in the light but hates a brother or sister is still in the darkness."
- Proverbs 26:24–26 – "Enemies disguise themselves with their lips, but in their hearts they harbor deceit. Though their speech is charming, do not believe them, for seven abominations fill their hearts. Their malice may be concealed by deception, but their wickedness will be exposed in the assembly."
- Titus 3:3 – "At one time we too were foolish, disobedient, deceived and enslaved by all kinds of passions and pleasures. We lived in malice and envy, being hated and hating one another."

 **Deliverance Prayer** Lord God Almighty, I renounce the demonic spirit of hatred and malice. I confess that I have harbored deeply aggressive, toxic thoughts toward those who crossed me. I break the murderous assignment of hatred over my mind. I refuse to walk in blindness or lie to myself about my spiritual state. I choose to love my enemies and pray for those who have intentionally harmed me. Flood my heart with Christ's supernatural love. In Jesus' name, Amen.

Daily Confession

- Eternal life resides richly in me. I entirely banish hatred from my heart, knowing that animosity is spiritually aligned with murder. (1 John 3:15)
- I walk in absolute truth and light. I love God by genuinely loving my brothers and sisters, casting out all deceptive patterns of hidden hatred. (1 John 4:20)
- I actively silence conflict. Hatred tries to stir up division, but I weaponize love to completely cover over and neutralize wrongs. (Proverbs 10:12)

The Scriptural Roots

- *The Blinding Veil:* 1 John 2:11 reveals that hatred operates by altering your spiritual vision: "But anyone who hates a brother or sister is in the darkness and walks around in the darkness... because the darkness has blinded them." Hatred convinces the soul that its

malice is fully justified, all while completely masking the fact that the person is walking off a spiritual cliff.

THE SPIRIT OF WEARINESS

Supporting Scriptures (NIV)

- Galatians 6:9 – "Let us not become weary in doing good, for at the proper time we will reap a harvest if we do not give up."
- Isaiah 40:29–31 – "He gives strength to the weary and increases the power of the weak. Even youths grow tired and weary, and young men stumble and fall; but those who hope in the Lord will renew their strength. They will soar on wings like eagles; they will run and not grow weary, they will walk and not be faint."
- Matthew 11:28–30 – "Come to me, all you who are weary and burdened, and I will give you rest. Take my yoke upon you and learn from me, for I am gentle and humble in heart, and you will find rest for your souls. For my yoke is easy and my burden is light."
- Jeremiah 31:25 – "I will refresh the weary and satisfy the faint."
- 2 Thessalonians 3:13 – "And as for you, brothers and sisters, never tire of doing what is good."
- Psalm 119:28 – "My soul is weary with sorrow; strengthen me according to your word."
- Hebrews 12:3 – "Consider him who endured such opposition from sinners, so that you will not grow weary and lose heart."
- Psalm 23:2–3 – "He makes me lie down in green pastures, he leads me beside quiet waters, he refreshes my soul."
- 1 Kings 19:4-5 – "while he himself went a day's journey into the wilderness. He came to a broom bush, sat down under it and prayed that he might die. 'I have had enough, Lord,' he said. 'Take my life; I am no better than my ancestors.' Then he lay down under the bush and fell asleep. All at once an angel touched him and said, 'Get up and eat.'"

 **Deliverance Prayer** Father, I confess that I am completely drained and heavy-laden. I break the assignment of premature quitting and spiritual exhaustion over my life. I reject the lie that my labor is in vain. I come to Jesus right now and exchange my crushed, heavy burdens for His light and easy yoke. I receive Your supernatural refreshment. Lord, renew my strength so I can run without fatigue and walk without fainting. My harvest is coming! In Jesus' name, Amen.

Daily Confession

- My harvest is absolute and guaranteed. I refuse to allow weariness into my service or my spirit, because I know I will reap a massive reward at the exact right time. (Galatians 6:9)
- My spiritual strength is continuously surging. I place my absolute hope in the Lord; therefore, I am soaring on eagle's wings, running without fatigue, and walking without fainting. (Isaiah 40:31)
- My soul rests in supernatural luxury. I have partnered with Jesus, stepped into His gentle rest, and left my heavy burdens behind. (Matthew 11:28–29)

The Scriptural Roots

- *Hope Deferred & Fainting:* The root of weariness is found in the Greek word *eklyo* used in Galatians 6:9, which means to unstring a bow or become physically unstrung and

paralyzed. Weariness targets your spiritual tension, slowly unstringing your faith until you are too loose and exhausted to launch any arrows against the enemy.
